I went through a brief orientation in Cairo about the United States. I liked everything here. No one will hassle you. I have some painful medical problems with digesting food and water. I don't know what it is, something that happened during the war.

Getting an education in most important. I want to go to school and graduate, but my medical problems prevent me from going at this moment.

I've made registration for the job corps and I am waiting for approval.
