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Sustainable Purchasing Policy

Introduction

Sustainable purchasing is an effective method used to create change in environmental, social, and economic issues through responsible sourcing. This document provides a purchasing guide for Tarbell's to implement these actions into their everyday business practices. The goal of these guidelines is to improve the sustainability impact of procurement by purchasing goods and services that advance Tarbell's sustainability goals. Purchasing from suppliers who share Tarbell's commitment to sustainability and leveraging buying power can incentivize others to work towards these same standards.

The purpose of this policy is to:

- Develop relationships with manufacturers who are committed to supporting sustainability initiatives and have good environmental and social track records;
- Include a diverse group of vendors including minority, locally, regionally, LGBTQ+, women, and/or veteran-owned vendors
- Encourage suppliers to utilize more sustainable practices
- Develop partnerships with local organizations to make sustainable purchases together and support local suppliers together as much as possible.

<u>How to Use</u>

- This guide is divided into different purchasing categories (ex. energy & appliances, water, food, alcohol, etc.) for ease of use
- Each category then has required policies and preferred policies
 - All vendors must meet at minimum the required items
 - Preferred items can help the organization choose between vendors or identify new suppliers that have more sustainable operations
- This guide can be provided to suppliers to identify new sustainability opportunities to further their initiatives
- This Sustainable Purchasing Policy aligns with Green Restaurant Association's certification and best industry practice including the EPA, EnergyStar, the Monterey Bay Aquarium, and more.

Energy & Appliances



Required:

Buy Energy Star rated appliances

Rented or third-party maintained equipment:

 Vendors should conduct annual maintenance checks on HVAC, lighting, hot water heating (or as often as recommended by manufacturer). Provide updates and alerts on failing equipment.

Use LED Lighting

• Use <u>Million LED</u> Challenge resource to find lighting replacements





Water & Filtration



Required:

All products should be EPA WaterSense® Certified (e.g. faucets, toilets, urinals)

Dishwashing pre-rinse sprayer at a flow rate of 1.15 or less

Landscape with native and drought tolerant plants





Waste/Recycling/Composting/ Oil & Grease Recycling



Required:

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General waste:

- Utilize any form available to divert waste from landfills (e.g. Recycling, composting, donating etc.)
- Oil & Grease Recycling: 100% conversion of used fats, oils, and grease into biodiesel or electricity OR must haul grease product to a company that converts 100% of the used grease into biodiesel or electricity

Labor Practices



Required:

All suppliers should have their own policies regarding the following-

Nondiscrimination:

 No discrimination with regard to hiring and employment practices, including salary, benefits, advancement, discipline, termination or retirement on the basis of race, religion, age, nationality, social or ethnic origin, sexual orientation, gender, political affiliation, disability, or physical impairment or handicap.

Coercion and Harassment:

 Treatment of all workers with dignity and respect. Disrespectful, inappropriate behavior, unfair treatment or retaliation of any kind will never be tolerated. Actions such as corporal punishment, threats of violence and/or other forms of physical, sexual, psychological, verbal abuse and/or harassment will never be allowed or condoned.

Health and Safety:

 Provide workers with a safe and healthy workplace (and housing, if applicable) in compliance with all applicable laws and regulations. At a minimum, must also ensure reasonable access to potable water, sanitary facilities, proper ventilation, adequate lighting and fire safety. In addition, are responsible for general emergency preparedness and machine maintenance and evaluations in order to comply with applicable safety standards. All required permits, licenses and registrations must be obtained, maintained and kept up-to date and made available upon request. Must satisfy their operational and reporting requirements to applicable legal and regulatory authorities.

Livable wages:

- The goal of a living wage is to allow employees to earn enough income for a satisfactory standard of living and prevent them from falling into poverty.

Food Sourcing: Animal Products



Required:

	Prioritize animal products grown/raised 1st- locally, 2nd- regionally, 3rd- nationally	
	 Must be from farms that feed the animals their natural diet and all animal welfare standards have to be followed: Freedom from hunger and thirst Freedom from fear and distress Freedom from discomfort Freedom from pain, injury or disease Freedom to express normal behavior 	
	No use of non-therapeutic, routinely-given antibiotics, or growth hormones	
Preferred:		
	100% Certified Organic to USDA standards or organically-sourced products with real food ingredients	
	Certified Humane Raised & Handled animal products	

- Prioritize animal products from within the state
- Certified Biodynamic or Regenerative Farm Practices

Seafood

Required:



Use the Seafood Watch database to determine which fish to buy



Food Sourcing: Produce



Required:

Certified organic, Organic but not certified, or Transitional organic

Prioritize produce grown 1st- locally, 2nd- regionally, 3rd- nationally, or 4thinternationally

Preferred:

Fertilized via compost, manure, cover crops, crop rotation/diversity

Family and/or small- to medium-sized farm

Certified Biodynamic or Regenerative Farm Practices

Seasonally





Food Sourcing: Dry Goods, Oils, Spices



Required:



Organic

Non-GMO

No hydrogenated/partially hydrogenated oils (e.g. no trans fats)

Preferred:



Buy products locally in bulk

Replacement of refined grains with whole grains, and unhealthy fats (e.g. trans and saturated fats) with healthy fats (unsaturated fats)

No Palm Oil Policy. If used, follow these guidelines:

- No development on High Conservation Value (HCV) landscape or High Carbon Stock (HCS) forests.
- No development on peatlands regardless of depth, and use of best management practices for existing plantations on peat.
- Traceability to the extraction mill and validation of fresh fruit bunches.

Use of soybeans using sustainable methods certified by the U.S. Soybean Export Council (USSEC)



Food Sourcing: Coffee, Tea, Chocolate



Required:

Has one or more of the following certifications: Fair-trade, Food Alliance, or Organic

Preferred:

Has two or more of the following certifications: Fair-trade, Food Alliance, or Organic





Alcohol: Wine, Beer, Spirits



Required:

Purchase 1st- locally, 2nd- organically, 3rd- regionally

Preferred:

Use regenerative farming practices





Cleaning



Required:



Chemical characteristics:

- Do not contain:
 - Carcinogens
 - Asthmagens
 - Skin irritants
 - Ozone depleting potential (ODP)
 - Combustibles
 - Items that result in hazardous decomposition products
 - Items that result in aquatic toxicity
 - Ingredients or degradation products that bioaccumulate
 - Ingredients that cause chronic inhalation toxicity
- Must contain:
 - Natural, bio-based, non-toxic ingredients
 - Individual organic ingredients that are readily biodegradable
 - VOC levels less than 0.1% for dilutable carpet cleaner and less that 1% for general-purpose, restroom, glass, and ready to use carpet cleaners
 - Less than 0.5% phosphorus
 - Only fragrances that follow the Code of Practice of the International Fragrance Association
 - Closed dilution-control concentrate labeling requirements
 - Color components are FDA certified or natural
 - Ingredients that are corrosive to or easily absorbed by the skin or cause serious eye damage (pH between 2 and 11.5)

Packaging & Disposables



Required:

No Styrofoam and EPS (expanded polystyrene foam)

Paper disposables:

- Containers are 1) compostable or 2) recyclable
- Made with minimum % of PCW (Post Consumer Waste), chlorine-free & unbleached:
 - Bags 95%
 - Hot Cup 10%
 - Kraft Paper rolls 50%
 - Dinner and Beverage napkins 60%
 - Paper towels Centerfold 80%
- Molded Fiber trays 100%
- Molded Fiber cup carriers -100%
- Take Out containers 35%
- Hot Cup sleeves 100%
- Paper towels multifold & roll- 85%
- Toilet paper 60%
- NO purchases from paper-based packaging products made with illegal fiber or the following unwanted sources:
 - Wood harvested from forests that have been converted to plantations or non-forest use
 - Wood from high conservation value forests, unless those forests are credibly certified
 - Wood where the source forest and species are unknown
 - Wood harvested in a manner that violates human rights
 - Wood harvested that violates local or international laws

Plastic disposables:

- Containers are recyclable
- Made with minimum % PCW:
 - Take-out containers 100%
 - Trash Liners 30%
 - Scrub Pads 90%
 - Cutlery 100%

- Cold Cups 25%
- Food Trays 100%
- Bowls 100%





Preferred:

Reusable

Locally compostable and certified by <u>R City's list of acceptable materials</u>

Certifications: Paper-packaging certified by a third-party, e.g. Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) and the Sustainable Forestry Initiative (SFI)





Linens & Uniforms



Required:

- <u>GOTS or Oeko-Tex</u> Certified
 - Designed for quality and durability
 - For laundry service: certified in TRSA's Clean Green Program

Preferred:



Made in U.S.A.

Made partly from recycled materials and/or 100% cotton



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Office & Kitchen Supplies



Required:			
	Reusable soy ink cartridge for printers		
	Plate and Glassware:100% recycled, 70% PCW recycled plastic, glass, metal		
	 No purchases from paper products made with illegal fiber or the following unwanted sources: Wood harvested from forests that have been converted to plantations or nonforest use Wood from high conservation value forests, unless those forests are credibly certified Wood where the source forest and species are unknown Wood harvested in a manner that violates human rights Wood harvested that violates local or international laws

Floral



Required:

Utilize local florists that sell local, native flowers then local florists, etc.

Preferred:

Use <u>Sustainable Floristry Network</u> (SFN) Stamp; committed to rejecting traditional, unsustainable ideas





Flooring & Flooring Adhesives @

Required:

Minimum one certification:

- GreenGuard Gold
- Cradle to Cradle Certified™
- FSC
- NSF/ANSI-140 Standard (carpet)
- Green Seal
- SCS FloorScore Standard
- Carpet and Rug Institute (CRI) Green Label Plus
- GREENGUARD® Gold
- SCS FloorScore Standard

Preferred:

Contains at least 10% post-consumer recycled content or 30% total recycled content
Has an Environmental Product Declaration (EPD) Transparency Summary
Uses "no glue" installation methods as these virtually eliminate VOCs from installation (below)

- Is free of the following chemicals of concern:
 - 1. Antimicrobials
 - 2.Coal fly ash
 - 3.Flame retardants
 - 4. Fluorinated stain resistant chemicals (e.g. per fluorinated chemicals (PFCs))
 - 5.Formaldehyde
 - 6.Lead
 - 7.Mercury
 - 8. Nanomaterials
 - 9.Phthalates
- 10.Polyvinyl chloride (PVC)



Furnishings & Décor



Required:



Candles

- 100% non-petroleum candles
- No lead wicks
- Recyclable container
- Rechargeable candles must use LED

Furniture:

- Minimum one certification:
 - FSC
 - GreenGuard
 - SCS Indoor Advantage
 - Cradle to Cradle Certified
 - GOTS or OekoTex
 - Declare Labels
 - BIFMA

Paints:

- No VOC paint or colorant
- GreenGuard Certified

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
