**Top Health Research Databases**

**PubMed: Open Access!** The primary database of information in the medical and health sciences fields. Open access searching interface for 'Medline.' Includes references from all areas of health, allied health, medicine, nursing, nutrition, and biomedical sciences.

**CINAHL:** Cumulative Index to Nursing and Allied Health Literature. Leading research from publications in the fields of nursing and allied health from 1982 to the present.

**Cochrane Library:** Provides access to reliable information compiled by the Cochrane Collaboration, an international network of individuals and institutions committed to preparing, maintaining, and disseminating systematic, up-to-date reviews of the effects of health care.

## Selecting a Journal

[Ulrichsweb](#) has bibliographic and contact information on over 300,000 journals.

[Cabell's Directory of Publishing Opportunities](#) identifies publishing opportunities in Management, Marketing, Educational Curriculum and Methods, Education, and Health Services.

The [Directory of Open Access Journals \(DOAJ\)](#) covers free, full-text scholarly journals that do not have article processing fees. However, many do. The ASU publishes which will reduce or cover article processing charges for ASU authors.

Note: as with any publishing opportunity, be wary of predatory publishers. See [for Determining Predatory Open Access Publishers](#). These are useful resources.

The Right to Research Coalition has a pamphlet: ["Optimize Your Publishing: A Guide to Open Access Publishing"](#) applicable to anyone looking to publish.

For detailed information about journal impact and ranking, explore the [Crossref Impact Factor](#).

[Eigenfactor.org](#) is another way to evaluate journals by impact. Additional [effectiveness](#), that is, the value per dollar that they provide. This feature allows you to compare journals by [Access Author Fees](#).

ASU Libraries have an institutional membership, which allows ASU authors to publish in Nucleic Acids Research journals. ASU authors receive the discount, authors must access the journal through the library system will recognise their membership and receive the discount.
- [PeerJ](#)  
PeerJ is an open access journal publishing platform. ASU authors with a basic lifetime membership can publish in PeerJ journals.
- [SpringerOpen](#)  
ASU Libraries have a Prepay Membership, which allows ASU authors to publish in Springer Open Choice journals.
