Pattye Casarow is currently the Administrative Assistant in the ASU Choral Department, serves as Senior Teaching Assistant, and is writing her dissertation on sight singing pedagogy to complete the DMA in choral conducting. She graduated from Grand Canyon University in 1989 with a degree in Music Education with proficiencies in voice and piano and K-12 state certification. She completed her Masters in Choral Music Education at ASU in 1997 and Kodály Certification in 2000. Ms. Casarow taught K-12 general music and choir in Georgia, New Jersey, and for 11 years at Mission Christian School in central Phoenix.

Michael Huff was born in Paris, France to a military family and began learning to play the piano just after he turned three years old. While a teenager, he studied piano at the *Hochschüle fur Musik* in Frankfurt, Germany. He attended the University of Utah where he obtained a Bachelor's Degree in Instrumental Music Education and is a candidate for the Master's Degree in Choral Conducting. In 1992 he was appointed associate conductor and accompanist for the Utah Symphony Chorus. He is also artistic director of *The National Invitational Choral Festival* and *The National Invitational Band & Orchestra Festival* held each spring in Dallas, New York City, Chicago, and Salt Lake City.
