He is a distinguished professor of piano at Arizona State University since 1986 having earned the honor of Regent Professor of Piano at this institution. He is the recipient of many piano performance awards in Europe and in his native country, Brazil. Pagano has performed throughout four continents in more than 600 public performances as recital soloist, chamber musician and as soloist with orchestras. He has premiered 24 works in concert halls worldwide, 16 of these were works written and dedicated to him by the composers, including several concertos for piano and orchestra. He has also recorded several of these works. Pagano was the first pianist to perform the complete works of Schoenberg in several capitals of the world.

Caio Pagano combines a profound knowledge of the Arts, Literature and Music, which characterizes his interpretations as authoritative and unique. His transcendent technique is accompanied by exuberant lyricism, intellect and a polished sense of style. The Washington Post's reviewer, Joseph McLellan, may have summed it up the best: "Pagano is such a fine performer that any opportunity to hear him should be seized." Pagano is an honorable Steinway Artist.

TIMOTHY RUSSELL is in his 21st year as a Professor of Music at Arizona State University, where he serves as Director of Orchestras and Director of the doctoral orchestral conducting program. A versatile conductor, Dr. Russell is equally skilled conducting music for symphonic concerts, chamber orchestra, large choral productions, pops concerts, and children's programs. He has conducted the world premiere performances of over 100 new compositions. Maestro Russell is the conductor and/or producer of 33 compact discs. His recordings have earned him critical acclaim and two Grammy nominations. This is Russell's twelfth season conducting Ballet Arizona's collaborations with The Phoenix Symphony. Maestro Russell just concluded his 35 year tenure as the music director of the award-winning ProMusica Chamber Orchestra of Columbus, Ohio. where he has been named Conductor Laureate. Dr. Russell has held academic appointments at his alma mater, The Ohio State University, as well as the University of Rochester, including its Eastman School of Music. He served for nine seasons as the Music Director and Conductor of The Naples Philharmonic.
