T.C. Smith Chunyang Wang Born in Incheon, Korea, JungHwan Kwon began studying conducting at the Presbyterian College of Seoul. After graduating at the top of his class, he received the First Prize in 2009 for both the International Conducting Competition at the University of Chongshin and at the 13th Seoul Oratorio Festival. He also received the Bronze Medal in 2008 at the Conducting Competition for the Korea Federation of Choral Music. Kwon obtained his Master of Music degree and studied with Franz Anton Krager at the Moores School of Music (University of Houston). In addition, he was an assistant conductor for the AURA Contemporary Ensemble and Moores School Symphony Orchestras. He was selected as a finalist, chosen from 105 applicants, for the Baltimore Symphony workshop, where he conducted Baltimore Symphony Orchestra and studied with Gustav Meier and Marin Alsop. He also attended the "Concoursul International de Dirijat Simfonic" at the Moldova - Chişinău (Sep. 2011) as a finalist. Kwon is currently pursuing a Doctor of Musical Arts degree in conducting at ASU, under the guidance of Dr. Timothy Russell and Dr. William Reber. He serves as the assistant conductor for the ASU Symphony Orchestra.
