Just a note of appreciation and thanks for your kind letter of June 13th in reference to Mr. Byron Wenger.


Mrs. Wenger stopped by yesterday and I had occasion to give her some of the basic information concerning the position here, which she will convey to her husband. In essence the situation is much the same as I wrote you, in that we are seeking a young man 35 years of age or younger for an appointment as assistant professor. The stipend will be \$3500-4000, depending entirely upon the individual's teaching record and research. Our teaching load is 12 clock hours per week for the academic year and any summer school teaching is for extra compensation, which, at the present time, runs to \$625 for six weeks session of three hours for five day week. There is unquestionably, for the right person, definite future with research opportunities and graduate school teaching.

If Mr. Wenger is interested in being considered for an appointment I would like to have him send us his vitae together with any reprints or titles of papers in press.

I found Mrs. Wenger a very pleasant and intelligent person and I am sure that she will give Mr. Wenger the information with whatever personal comments she may feel are in order.
